- Testing requirement to be updated in the Radio Requirement Policy
  - 4 of each of the following are required to be submitted to the SWIC for testing:
    - Radios requiring testing
    - Belt Clips or holsters
    - Remote speaker microphones
    - Chargers
    - Programming Cables
    - Encryption cables for use with Motorola KVL
    - Programming software that does not expire
    - Software System key
    - If Hardware key is also available, Master key shall be provided with four daughter keys
  - Portal address with 4 usernames and passwords for programming software and firmware updates (One username and password available to the four testers is acceptable)
  - It is recommended that radios be equipped with any and all options available for the radio model. A 4000-channel radio that is provided with 2000 channels will be a Level 2 radio as it was not tested with the requirement for Level 1. Include absolutely anything you want tested now and in the future. Updating options released later will potentially require testing prior to release of that option being available for sale. No feature shall be approved without prior recommended approval of the Technical Committee to the SIEC.
  - Adding desired specifications to Radio Requirement/Approved Equipment, such as desired number of characters in a display on a Portable or Mobile radio.
- FBI is going to add a radio to their existing rack of equipment. No objection.
- SP Charlestown talkgroup has been turned back on.
- Cyber-Subcommittee met in a virtual meeting that FEMA put on.
- DNR has requested 10 talkgroups. Several teams that function statewide for Special OPs. They also wanted to add channels for several park areas. Those will be more regional in nature. They will name them appropriately and advise the SWIC. Motion Dan Kirby, Second Tony Novel. No objections.

## **PLANNING COMMITTEE**

- Frontier Update – Located 3 sites for the “tie-in” to their network. This is only for PSAP’s to use in emergency situations when 911 Telephone services may not be available. This is just another way to increase redundancy.
- Lick Knob – Looking to replace Lick with a 3-site simulcast system. Budgetary estimate for 3 sites is \$14,975,689. This projects also consists on working with Boone Co. that would increase coverage in portions of their county. No ideal places have been found at this time. A lot of obstacles have posed a challenge.

## **CURRENT AND EMERGING TECHNOLOGIES**

- AT&T WIFI calling – cell pro boosters in schools seem to work. Contact DJ if interested.
- Mini CRD’s are also available for demo. Several counties have already reached out for testing.
- NG911 Conference at the end of the month in Charleston. 3/25-28/2024. Programming class to be held on 3/29.

## **COUNTY / AGENCY NEWS**

- Raleigh County – request has been made to demo the mini CRD’s from AT&T for testing. Will be having a kickoff meeting for a communications exercise with region 1 healthcare coalition. This will be similar to the exercise that was done a few years ago with all the regional 911 centers, emergency management, healthcare facilities, hospitals, and health departments. More information to come. Also sat through a demo with TangoTango. Nicholas County also in demo stage now. Nicholas County has had very good results with the product so far. It allows you to communicate on one talkgroup, anywhere as long as you have cellular or wifi connection.
- Summers County – Loyd Lowery in the new Summers County 911/OEM. Mr. Lowery was welcomed to the group and had nothing further to report.
- Fayette County – Waiting o Valley Tower to be constructed. Site prep is starting. Additionally, Fayette OEM has a drone as a deployable resource. There is a class coming up for pilots on 5/14-17/24 and it is currently at max capacity. Another one may be scheduled in the future based on previous interest and participation.
- SWIC – Discussed smart connect. SIRN does have a statewide SSID or it can be obtained in respective county. Has additional information on firewalls and can distribute to anyone who needs it. // Radio Authentication – multi-year project that will help eliminate duplicate ID’s on the system. Any unmatched radio will be rejected for use until the issue is resolved. Project can potentially cost approximately 600K, and most of that cost is associated with licenses.
- WVSP – Have a few Viking radios in testing. No issues so far. Kevin White. Role will be assumed by Ethan Whisenant moving forward.
- National Park Service – Have some radio equipment that has arrived. Did some testing with APX NEXT radio, no issues reported.
- Zach Honaker – Nothing to report.
- Monroe County – Nothing to report.
- McDowell County – Nothing to report.

- Wyoming County – Hanover site now operational. Had some issues with a repeater but have since been resolved.
- Greenbrier County – MCC7500 kickoff meeting was held earlier in the week. Excited to get that project started.
- Beckley Fire – Nothing to report.
- Bradley VFD – Nothing to report.
- Nicholas County – MCA began install of 7500 in their new location. Still underway at this time.
- Higher Education (David Lord) – Nothing new however, no update on radio issues. Work request was completed at conference last year. Kevin White will check in with Rodney for an update.

- Membership Involvement and Voting Members – Mr. Zilinski indicated there were several vacancies within the RIC and several roles needed filled.
